<sup>\*</sup>Socially Disadvantaged Individuals are defined as those who have been historically subjected to racial or ethnic prejudice or cultural bias within the larger American culture. Identified groups include: African Americans, Asian Pacific Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Subcontinent Asian Americans, Women, or others deemed disadvantaged by the SBA.

<sup>\*\*</sup>Economically Disadvantaged Individuals are defined as those for whom impaired access to financial opportunities has hampered the ability to compete in the free enterprise system, in contrast to people in similar businesses not identified as socially disadvantaged.
